LAST WEEK

Our meeting on Tuesday April 26 was a combined meeting with Randwick and Maroubra Rotary Clubs to hear about the work of ROMAC from Dr. Peter Grant, a cardiothoracic surgeon from the Sydney Children's Hospital. Over recent years Dr Grant has performed lifesaving open heart operations on 10 ROMAC patients, aged from new born to 16 years, and coming from our Pacific Island nations of Solomon Islands, Indonesia, Tuvalu, Timor Leste and Vanuatu.



Peter spoke to us about the common heart surgeries he performs under ROMAC

- **PDA**

Patent ductus arteriosus (PDA) is a heart problem that occurs soon after birth in some babies. In PDA, abnormal blood flow occurs between two of the major arteries connected to the heart.

Before birth, the two major arteries—the aorta and the pulmonary artery are connected by a blood vessel called the ductus arteriosus. This vessel is an essential part of fetal blood circulation.

Within minutes or up to a few days after birth, the vessel is supposed to close as part of the normal changes occurring in the baby's circulation.

In some babies, however, the ductus arteriosus remains open (patent). This opening allows oxygen-rich blood from the aorta to mix with oxygen-poor blood from the pulmonary artery. This can put strain on the heart and increase blood pressure in the lung arteries.

- **VSD**

VSD is a hole in the wall separating the two lower chambers of the heart.

In normal development, the wall between the chambers closes before the fetus is born, so that by birth, oxygen-rich blood is kept from mixing with the oxygen-poor blood. When the hole does not close, it may cause higher pressure in the heart or reduced oxygen to the body.

Closing a large VSD by open-heart surgery usually is done in infancy or childhood even in patients with few symptoms, to prevent complications later. Usually a patch of fabric or pericardium (the normal lining around the outside of the heart) is sewn over the VSD to close it completely. Later this patch is covered by the normal heart lining tissue and becomes a permanent part of the heart. Some defects can be sewn closed without a patch

- COA

Coarctation of the Aorta. In this condition the aorta (the main artery that carries blood from the heart to the body) is narrowed or constricted.

In most children, the cause isn't known. Some children can have other heart defects along with coarctation.

Coarctation obstructs blood flow from the heart to the lower part of the body. Blood pressure increases above the constriction. The blood pressure is much higher than normal in the left pumping chamber (left ventricle) and the heart must work harder to pump blood through the constriction in the aorta. This can cause thickening (hypertrophy) and damage to the overworked heart muscle.

The coarctation obstruction can be relieved using surgery or catheterization.

- TGA

Transposition of the great arteries. The Aorta arises from the right ventricle and receives "blue" blood, whilst the Pulmonary Artery arises from the left ventricle. The baby becomes blue immediately after birth and needs urgent treatment.

Early surgery is essential and involves the "Arterial Switch Operation", which is carried out in the first week or two of life and corrects the abnormality. The small coronary arteries, which feed the heart muscle with blood, need to be transferred as well as the two Great Arteries (Aorta and Pulmonary Artery).




The third strategic priority – enhancing public image and awareness.
